RULES OF THE SOCIETY

1. All classes are open to amateurs only.
2. The exhibitor must have grown all specimens, except classes in the Floral Art Section. Persons infringing this rule will be disqualified and excluded from all exhibitions in the future.
3. All entries will be accepted at the Hall on Wednesday evening, 22nd September 2010 from 7 to 8:30 pm, by the Secretary, or may be sent by post to the Secretary on or before 23rd September 2010.
ENTRIES RECEIVED AFTER THIS DATE MAY BE REFUSED
4. Exhibitors are allowed any number of entries in each class but may take only one money prize.
5. The Village Hall will be open to exhibitors to stage their exhibits on Friday 24th September 2010 from 7:30 to 8:30 pm and also from 9 to 10:30am on Saturday 25th September 2010.
6. The Show will be open from 3pm and NO SPECIMEN MAY BE REMOVED before 4:30pm without permission.
7. The society will not be responsible for any damage that may be done to articles exhibited.
8. Exhibitors to state on number tickets whether articles are for sale or not. If two exhibits, First and Second prize will be given. If three exhibits, First, Second and Third prizes may be given unless specifically recommended by the Judges.
10. The Treasurer shall pay prize money in the hall at 4:15 pm. Prize money not claimed by the Wednesday after the show will be put into show funds.
11. All exhibits will be sold unless reserved at time of entry. The produce, which is for sale will be auctioned after presentation of prizes at 4:15pm. Proceeds to the show funds.
12. Aggregate Cups: First prizes count - 3 points, Second - 2 points, Third - 1 point.
13. The runners - up for the Aggregate cups will receive £2.00.
